Greetings from Get Rattled,

Thank you for registering for our Spring 2019 Rattlesnake Avoidance Training for Dogs in Placerville, CA.

We have **Barkley** scheduled on Sunday, April 14th 2019, at **10 am**

This class is going to be held at Pleasant Valley Pet Clinic, 4561 Pleasant Valley Rd. Placerville, CA. 95667. If you have any trouble finding us, please feel free to give us a call at 775-234-8844.

For those of you attending a rattlesnake avoidance training for the first time, here is some necessary information and instructions:

- Please have your dog(s) on a leash and under control at all times to prevent any fights, running away or accidents.
- We will provide our own collars, leashes and equipment for the training.
- Your dog(s) do not require any special treatment or preparation before arrival, just go about business as usual. And same goes for after the class is over.
- If you have an intact female that is going into heat, please contact us before coming to the class as that can provide a major distraction. However we do have ways around that which we can discuss.
- Please arrive about 10 – 15 minutes prior to appointment time to complete any registration/Waiver paperwork that may not have been previously completed.
- Appointments are done in small groups per hour block. While you most likely will be done in less than an hour, we ask that you plan for an hour stay.
- Please understand that while we do our best to stay on time, sometimes we do encounter unforeseeable circumstances, such as dogs requiring additional training, which could set us back. We want to ensure every dog leaves wanting to avoid rattlesnakes, even if that means spending extra time. We will do our absolute best to minimize any wait times.
- We do use electronic collars in a negative reinforcement situation. Our handlers will ask a series of questions to understand your dog's unique personality, drive, circumstances, health conditions, etc... so we can adjust the training accordingly. While we make every effort to use the minimum stimulus to get maximum efficiency, there is no way for us to anticipate each individual dog's reaction to the stimulus. We just want to forewarn you that your dog(s) may jump, yelp, or in rare instances, may even urinate or defecate. But please know that we want everything about this class to be a positive experience, except for their encounters with the snakes.
- If you have any problems, questions, concerns or criticisms, please feel free to talk with any of our staff, via e-mail, or by phone. Our ultimate goals are saving dog's lives as well as customer satisfaction.
